The Apostle John understands that it is like abiding by/with Jesus Christ, who is the **love of God**. The Apostle Paul understands that it is like clothing oneself with Jesus Christ, who is God's humility and righteousness. Also, through the Synoptic Gospels, which are Matthew, Mark, and Luke, we can see that Jesus very strongly taught of embodying God's mercy, holiness, righteousness, and so on inwardly and outwardly. All these scriptural understandings commonly point to us about one vital thing. It's the life of **being one with Jesus Christ**.

Amen.



God's Valentine

Most Americans love Valentine's Day because it is a day when love is celebrated with hugs, kisses, cards, flowers, chocolates – and hearts. Throughout human history the human heart is celebrated as the center, the character of a person – "She has a good heart." The heart is the love one has for self and others, the source of feeling, and even thinking – "He needs to think more with his heart." The heart is also a symbol of life, spirit, and sacrifice – especially in Christian Tradition.

Going as far back as the Second Century and St. Justin Martyr, the heart of Jesus has been seen as a symbol of love, sacrifice, the essence of God's gift of life itself – "The heart of existence."

Through the centuries, many Roman Catholics have associated with and celebrated Jesus' Heart, calling it the "Sacred Heart of Je-

sus." You may have seen pictures or statues of the Sacred Heart: a heart exposed and entrusted to humanity – God giving away His heart.

Some renderings of the Sacred Heart show it exposed on Jesus' chest, surrounded by flames and a crown of thorns with a cross on top. In these renderings, Jesus exposes God's "burning heart (radical love)" and makes it vulnerable in order to give it away (even though it may not be reciprocated).

A symbol of Jesus' love for humanity and his willingness to sacrifice it for us all, some pictures of the Sacred Heart will have several drops of blood, which with the crown of thorns, call to mind Jesus being lanced while hanging from a cross, after suffering so much from the hands of those he loves and forgives. Jesus becomes humanity's "Blood Brother."

Regardless of one's religious tradition, one may contemplate Jesus' heart as "God's Valentine" gift, freely given (entrusted) in love to all – a love which generates love of self, others, all Creation, God.

Many of us can remember a popular song from the past, entitled "Heart of My Heart." The first stanza begins:

Heart of My Heart, I love that melody Heart of My Heart brings back a memory ...

This Valentine's Day may stir for many a memory of the pure, unconditional love God gives each one of us, without exception, radiating from the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is a gift given each moment – a gift which holds us in existence and enables us to mirror God's unfailing love for all and everything ... May it be so.

And in his letter to the Philippians, he wrote: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything, by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God" (Phil. 4:6.)



Thanks to everyone in the church family who participated in last December's communications survey which focused on our monthly newsletter, *The Twig Bender*.

One result of that survey is that we'll no longer print the paper edition of *The Twig Bender* in color as we had done a couple of times last fall. The overwhelming feedback we got -80% – indicated that respondents didn't think a newsletter in color was worth the extra expense. So be it.



Another other result of the survey is that we'll keep on doing what we've been doing: we'll continue publishing all the regular newsletter features. In the table below, you can see how those regular features scored in the survey, on the one to five scale:

Those scores help me prioritize what I can leave out if necessary due to any emergent space limitation; although this hasn't been much of a problem in the past.

Thanks to our authors, proofreaders and production team for helping to make *The Twig Bender* the quality communications tool that the People of Greenwood deserve.




Greenwood's Women's Circles
