From the Pastor Resurrection Prepares and Sustains Us

Jesus said to her, "I am the Resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" – John 11:25-26

As we prepare for Resurrection Sunday, the Revised Common Lectionary provides Scripture to prepare us. The gospel selection of John 11 speaks to the essence and purpose of it all. Jesus's raising of Lazarus from the dead is a foreshadowing of the real thing—the conquering of death forever. When Jesus tells Lazarus to come forth his burial cloths continue to cling to him. In contrast, Jesus' burial cloths are folded neatly



in a pile, and the resurrected Christ is no longer in the tomb. Every time I read this passage of Scripture, I think about all the possibilities, which are only found in the power of Jesus' resurrection. Not just the promise "to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord," but also what the power of Jesus' resurrection can do in THIS LIFE. There is no limit to the power of Jesus' resurrection. God

The remaining faithful and active members of Laurel Park UMC have resolved to merge with Greenwood UMC in the hopes of continuing to be connected as a community of faith and living into the possibilities of this season. While this decision has been really difficult for the members of Laurel Park, the power of Jesus' resurrection gives us hope.

Because of Jesus' resurrection, when something dies, something new can grow in its place. If we only BELIEVE.
