Christmas Isn't Over Yet

I erry Christmas and Happy New Year to you!

Have you had a Merry Christmas with your family and friends? Do not forget that *Christmas is not over yet*. Christmas does not mean the one day, which is on December 25 but lasts for twelve days until Epiphany, which is January 6. It's Christmastide, the season of Christmas. Biblically and liturgically Christmas ends with the story of the Magi in the Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12.

The Magi story is one of the most popular Christmas stories. We begin with this story every single New Year's. It's the story of the first worshipers who followed the heavenly light, rather than the earthly light, and worshiped the newborn King - Christ Child. It should be our faith story because we are believers and worshipers in the name of Jesus Christ. Therefore, simply, let us follow God's light rather than our worldly lights throughout 2024.

Do not forget that various stereotypes that we have cannot make a difference. God's way to be with us is not stereotypical at all. Rather, it is the opposite and even subversive. We can hear and see it through Christmas stories like the story of the Magi. After worshiping the Christ Child, they went back to their own country,

not by the route that they had come but by another. They did not follow their own stereotypes. **They simply followed the words of God** given through a dream.

We know through the whole story of the Magi that they also traveled from the east to Jerusalem to meet the newborn king. They had **followed the light of the star**. When they arrived at Jerusalem, they first visited King Herod to meet the newborn King. They followed their

common sense and knowledge that the newborn King must be in a palace. However, the Christ Child was not there. They had to leave there.

The **light of the star continued to guide their way** and then stood over the place, Bethlehem, where the Christ Child was. When they saw the star, they were filled with *JOY*. They *entered* the house and *saw* the Christ Child - the newborn King. They *knelt* before him, *honored* him, and *presented* him with three treasures, gold, frankincense, and myrrh, which meant the treasures for a king. Please see the five verbs – *entered, saw, knelt, honored,* and *presented*. These are the verbs for a worshiping body. And let us remember that to worship is to express JOY to God.



Friends, faith in Jesus Christ can be translated into change, difference, or newness. I encourage you to be open and move forward to change, difference, or newness without fear, in Christ Jesus. It's because Jesus Christ is Emmanuel, God-With-Us.

> In this year 2024, I hope and **bless all of Greenwood UMC** will follow the light of God thoroughly, and joyfully and faithfully worship God with your whole body, mind, and spirit. Through

doing so, we may be implementing God's call: "Rise and shine" (Isaiah 60:1).

Frances Stalnaker, My Mom

I'm going to take a point of personal privilege as your newsletter editor and write about my Mother, Frances Ansel Stalnaker, who passed away last month.

A child of the Great Depression – born in 1929 – Mom experienced the hardship of poverty and of being orphaned before she was 10 years old. Later, Mom had to deal with a failed first marriage and the challenges of being a young, single mother in the early 1950s.

By the grace of God, Mom overcame these challenges through her faith. She was raised by a loving aunt and uncle and in 1952 was blessed with marriage to the love of her life, my Dad, Howard Stalnaker. Mom and Dad enjoyed the blessings of a Christian family life, making a loving home for me, my Sister and my Brother, until Dad was called home by God in 2008.

In the intervening years, Mom always missed being with Dad. She once told me that she didn't mind dying because she knew she'd be reunited in Heaven with the love of her life through God's faithfulness and through her Savior, Jesus Christ.

Mom suffered from renal, cardiac and respiratory health issues all summer and fall. She eventually got

He was right ... I have turned the corner and am currently living in the fun-filled summer of my life that I had been hoping and praying for.

Receiving those transplants has been, without a doubt, the greatest blessing that I have ever received. And I thank God for that blessing each and every day.
